Message from Maxine Howells – Chair of Governors



A couple of weeks ago, at the first governing body meeting of the school year, I was pleased to be voted in as chair again for the second year. It is such a privilege to be involved with any school in this way and I would like to reassure you that I am committed to doing the best I can in this role to enable your school to be the best it can be for your children.

As an ex headteacher myself and still involved within education, I am acutely aware of the benefits governors can bring. Our 3 main roles are to:

- 1. Set the vision and strategic direction of the school. At Little Paxton, there is already a vision, "Together, we grow deep roots in learning and strong wings to soar". We consider how the work of the school matches this. In the Spring term we will be taking a closer look at this statement and what it means for us, considering whether it is still right (it very well may be) and then taking a wider strategic look at planning forward.
- 2. Holding leaders to account for the educational performance of the school. This had been an area of weakness for governors historically at Little Paxton as picked out in the 2020 Ofsted. Supported by the Local Authority and following some training ourselves, this is something where I feel as governing body we are now much better. We both support and challenge our school leaders.

3. Overseeing the financial performance of the school. At Little Paxton, as chair, I see an overview of all budget planning, we have a finance governor and have just set up a resources and finance committee. This is an area we are looking to strengthen further.

- 4 FGB meetings per year
- 3 committee meetings per year (if resources and finance, these may be virtual)
- 3 school visits per year

All training is provided, an interest in finance is a benefit but not essential. We just want people committed to supporting and challenging our school leaders on the further improvement of Little Paxton Primary.

Here are a few examples of what our money could mean to people supported by Macmillan

£551.50 could pay for a Macmillan Nurse for just over 15 hours, helping people living with cancer and their families receive essential medical, practical and emotional support.

£551.50 could pay for a Macmillan Information and Support Assistant for over 30.5 hours, giving people living with cancer the opportunity to ask questions and talk through their concerns.

£518 could support our Cancer Information and Support team to run our Macmillan Support Line phone service for an hour. In this time, they could deal with 24 calls and web enquiries from people who want questions answered, need practical or financial support.

The remaining £33.5 could pay for 75 copies of The Cancer Guide. This Macmillan booklet can help someone recently diagnosed with cancer and their families, understand more about cancer, its treatment, and the help available.
