

Nathan went away with a book from the Headteacher's Stash! On Monday the children performed brilliantly in their poetry assemblies, it is fantastic that we are learning poems off by heart now as part of our English lessons! Sports wise this week our Netball Team represented the school brilliantly at the county finals (more later in the press from a very proud Mrs Webb) and our Year 6 Paxton Panthers football team are currently playing in a tournament, I will let you know how they got on after half term!

On Wednesday our School Improvement Advisor visited us for the morning. Sue Bowman caught up with Mr Saxby and myself and then had a tour of the school from Roman and Samar in Year 5. She said that both children were very articulate and were able to share with her lots of positive things about Little Paxton, as well as saying the things they would like to see changed. We had the opportunity to share our improvement priorities for next year and also to talk through the work that has been happening to get our curriculum ready for September. Mr Saxby has been taking the lead on this and has worked with other subject leads on History, Geography, MFL (French) and PSHE. This has been a really exciting piece of work and Sue was very

impressed. She said that the curriculum is very strong and will take us forward even further and make learning even better for our children. This morning I was invited to share our experience of the Ofsted Pilot Inspection with other heads from the county and she also shared about how brilliant our curriculum design is and encouraged people who were developing their curriculum to get in touch with us so we could support them! So a massive thank you to Mr Saxby for his excellent work!

Have a wonderful half term, whatever you are doing, and we look forward to welcoming you back to school on Monday 2nd June at 8.40am when the gates open!



Message from Mrs Rider

Hello to our Paxton Families! I cannot believe we are in our last week of this half term and we have just one half term left of this year! There will be the beginning of big changes next term as all the children start to get ready to move up into their new year group and there's lots of anticipation about new teachers, classrooms etc. It is a big change for most of our children.

The move from Reception to Year 1 is an exciting and important milestone in your child's learning journey. While many children are ready to embrace new challenges, this transition can feel like a big step as routines and expectations begin to change. As a parent or carer, your support plays a vital role in making this change smooth and positive.

Here's how you can help your child feel confident and ready for Year 1:

1. Talk Positively About the Change

Children take their emotional cues from the adults around them. Speak confidently and cheerfully about Year 1, focusing on the new things they'll get to learn and do. Reassure them that it's normal to feel a little nervous and that their new teacher is excited to meet them.

2. Encourage Independence

In Year 1, children are encouraged to take more responsibility. You can support this at home by:

- Letting them pack and carry their own school bag
- Encouraging them to dress independently
- Asking them to tidy up after activities

These small steps build confidence and resilience.

3. Keep Learning Fun Over the Summer

The shift from play-based learning in Reception to more structured lessons in Year 1 can feel like a change. Over the summer, keep learning light and enjoyable:

- Read together every day
- Practise writing through postcards, shopping lists, or drawing and labelling pictures
- Explore simple maths through games, baking, or counting activities

4. Talk About Feelings

Create space for your child to express how they're feeling about the change. You could ask: "What are you looking forward to in Year 1?", "Is there anything you're unsure or curious about?"

5. Keep Routines Steady

Children thrive on predictability. As September approaches, gradually reintroduce familiar school routines: set regular bedtimes, morning wake ups, and time for reading or quiet play. This helps your child feel ready for the new term.

I hope this helps and I wish everyone an enjoyable and safe half term!






Housekeeping




