Hello and happy Friday to our Little Paxton families!

Even though the children have only been in school for 4 days we have certainly managed to pack a lot in. There has been lots of brilliant learning going on in our classes so there are lots of things to share and celebrate with you all.

We had another fantastic training day on Monday for our teaching team. There was training on assessing writing accurately, supporting children who have experienced trauma, training from the Occupational Therapist Team and then time in the afternoon to complete end of year assessments. It was great to have the chance to be together as a team and to get some fantastic training. Lots of the staff have already begun to use some of the strategies from the training with our children. We managed to all stay cool with an ice pop and by working in the hall. I can't believe that we planned a training day for one of the hottest days of the year, I hope that you managed to enjoy the extra time with your family in the lovely weather.

Our Larks and Merlins have been looking at the story 'Handa's Surprise' as part of their learning this week. This is a fantastic book if you haven't read it, it is one of my favourites. The children have been writing sentences about the fruit that falls into Handa's basket and the animals that she meets. I had a very proud **Tanthwe** come to visit and share his writing with me. **Maxwell**, who had come with Tanthwe, asked if I would like to see his writing as well so went and got it. Both children had written fantastic sentences using great adjectives, they both had a dip in my Headteacher's Stash Bag and chose a tiny rubber duck each (there is a photo of the proud boys in the press). Oliver H from Year 4 brought some marvellous Maths to share with me where he had to find as many ways as possible to make 42. His mini whiteboard was full of ideas, he really had thought outside the box (there is a photo of a very proud **Oliver** in the press as well). I have

a list of children to visit today who want to share their learning with me and I am really looking forward to having the chance to do this.

On Tuesday, we had the police visit to deliver an assembly. I have never seen the children in Years 4 to 6 walk into assembly so quietly and standing so tall. We invited PC Croft, who brought a team with him, to speak to the children about Racism. We wanted the children to understand what Racist Language is and that they shouldn't be using discriminatory words they hear in songs or in films. They also spoke about all protected characteristics. The children listened really well and it is fantastic to be able to partner with the police. Mr Saxby and I were pleased to hear that they offer a session on mobile phones and cyber bullying as this is something we feel the children really need to understand. Both of these really important lessons are part of our PSHE curriculum, and also our assembly programme, but sometimes the message needs to be said in a different way by a different person for it really to sink in.

This week we had a really positive meeting with a local school's work charity who actually came in to ask for some help from school for an older child who needs some work experience and in exchange asked what they could offer us. I asked if they delivered any coaching/mentoring sessions for children to support with behaviour, emotional regulation and those children facing significant challenges in their lives (especially those who have experienced trauma). They said they could offer something for 4 children initially and may have capacity to give us more support. For some of our children this support is much needed and I am delighted that 4 children could access free sessions (which started yesterday) and will continue at least until the end of term.

It is our second Praise Point Celebration this afternoon for those children who have achieved 50 praise points by this point in the year, I am really glad to be celebrating with these children, they should be very proud of their achievement. Congratulations to **Eveline, Lola, Amber, Addison, Harriet and Juliette** who have all reached 50 praise points! Fantastic job!

UPPER SCHOOL: Ava H



Hello to all our families! The weather has been warming up A LOT this week and one of the first things our children want to do is to get outside and play in the paddling pools or water trays. As the weather warms up, outdoor learning becomes even more exciting—and at our school, we love making the most of it! Two key aspects of summer activities are water play and sun safety.

Both contribute to children's development, enjoyment, and wellbeing, and we're proud to promote safe, purposeful outdoor experiences for our children.

Water play isn't just fun—it's an important part of early learning. Whether children are pouring, measuring, or exploring textures, they are developing critical skills across many areas of the curriculum:

- Maths: Water play naturally introduces concepts such as volume, capacity, comparison, and estimation.
- **Science:** Children learn about cause and effect, properties of water, and basic physics through hands-on exploration.
- **Communication and Language:** Working together at the water tray encourages conversation, collaboration, and storytelling.
- **Fine Motor Skills:** Scooping, pouring, squeezing and manipulating water tools support hand-eye coordination and muscle development.

Water play is also soothing and sensory, supporting emotional regulation and imaginative play. We encourage children across Early Years and Key Stage 1 to explore water play safely and with enthusiasm.

With longer days and stronger sun, it's vital that children are protected while enjoying time outdoors. At school, we take sun safety seriously by encouraging a few simple habits: hats, sun cream, hydration, shade. Teaching children about sun safety from a young age helps them build lifelong habits that keep them safe and healthy while enjoying the sunshine.

By combining engaging outdoor activities like water play with clear sun safety guidance, we give our pupils the best of both worlds—fun, learning, and wellbeing.

We hope you have fun in the sun this weekend and getting outside as safely and as much as you can!
