Hello and happy Friday and happy summer to you all!

Thank you, thank you, thank you for your support this school year. It has been such a successful one. We are so fortunate to have such a brilliant school community.

Today we say goodbye to our Year 6 Class 2425 - each one of them has definitely left their mark on the school and will be greatly missed. We wish them every success and happiness as they move onto their next adventures at secondary school. Go and be great Year 6, we are so fortunate to have had you as part of our school family! I also would like to say goodbye and thank you to many of our families who have had children at our school for a number of years and their last child is flying the Little Paxton nest today - thank you for your enthusiasm and encouragement throughout the years you will be missed. We also say goodbye and thank you today to Miss Peate and sadly Miss Mourton is also leaving us for a new role in another local school where she has been given full time hours. Both these ladies will be missed by the staff and children.

The children have been incredible all year and we are so proud of the progress they have made and who they are. We have loved getting to know our new EYFS children, and families, and they are so ready for Year 1. Every single child has made progress from their starting points and we are so glad each one of them is part of our school.

Looking forward

As part of our school development plan next year we will be looking for more opportunities to share how you can help at home so look out for information sessions and also the return of 'Come, See and Celebrate' where you are able to come into school and join in with the learning in the classrooms. In addition, there will be a big focus on writing for us as a school. Mr Simkin, as English Lead, has lots put in place already and I am sure he will be in touch with additional information in the future about how you can support at home. We will be launching our new curriculum in French, History and Geography in September which will enable us to focus on key concepts in these subjects that will be taught across the school so that the children learn less in more detail! There will be more information coming in September about this but know we are very excited about the difference this will make for our children, and our teachers.

Thank you to everyone who helped input into the vision for Little Paxton. You will find the final copy, which has been agreed by governors, attached. I am really delighted with it as I feel it really reflects who we are as a school community. Mr Saxby has also done an amazing job with writing our behaviour policy from scratch so that it really supports the children and staff. It is also clear, consistent and fair. We are using an electronic system to log behaviour issues so we are able to track behaviour and pick up on ongoing issues. As a leadership team we are constantly striving to improve how we use this tool to ensure that we are proactive rather than reactive. Our new behaviour policy is now available on our website.

In order to make communication, support and monitoring even more effective next year we have made a small change to the leadership structure which we believe will have a big impact for our children, our families and our staff. Miss Dellar will now be our Lower School Lead so will be the first person to contact if you need support with anything after having contacted your child's class teacher. She will be looking after EYFS, Year 1 and Year 2. Mr Crabb will now be our Upper School Lead, he will be the first person to contact if you need support if your child is in Years 3, 4, 5 or 6 as these are the year groups he will be looking after. To make it easy for you to catch them, they will be on the playground with myself or Mr Saxby each week before school - Mr Crabb on a Wednesday and Miss Dellar on a Thursday. Mrs Jeakings will also be available on a Monday morning on the playground before school.

Let's Celebrate

We have had a very busy year with lots to celebrate. I always find the end of the year a good time to look back and remember what we have achieved together. So if you're sitting comfortably, I'll begin:

In September we welcomed our new EYFS children and their families to our school community and they have thrived and flourished; we raised a massive £655 at our Macmillan breakfast whilst wearing green; we had a fantastic Hindu workshop day. October was the month of wellie swaps, the Harvest Festival celebrations in St James' Church and our Spooky Disco. During November we had an excellent time with Sean Rose visiting and inspiring us - reminding us that we have the choice to GIVE UP or GET ON; we raised £270 for the Royal British Legion and created a mile of money for Children in Need; we also celebrated Diwali in lots of different ways. Moving onto December, our Year 4 children went on their residential to Burwell House; the Christmas Fayre was a massive success and we supported the Round Table's Santa's Sleigh again this year. In other Christmassy festivities our Year 1 and 2 children performed a fantastic nativity play; our EYFS Christmas Tea Party was so special; KS2 children sang at the church AND our choir visited Bethany Hall in the village to sing to the residents! In January I was replaced by Audrey as Headteacher for Break the Rules day; the whole school went to the Pantomime (OH YES WE DID); we took the choir to Young Voices at the O2; we launched Arbor; welcomed Lucy Conrad to help organise our library and took our Year 6 children to Hilltop on their residential (some of our children stayed behind and became mini teachers for the week). We seemed to have a bit of a rest in February but we did celebrate Luna New Year including eating Chinese food in school! March, apparently the beginning of spring, saw us celebrate World Book Day together and our children took part in Bikeability. In April we celebrated our amazing volunteers during Volunteer Appreciation Week; took part in the county cross country and delivered the Village News. We finished the month, and the term, with an amazing colour run which was just incredible! We celebrated 80 years since VE day in May including Toby raising the flag for the whole village and the Year 6 children totally smashed their SATS. June was very busy with our Father's Day gift shop; lots happening in the garden; our Year 1 and Year 4 children completing the Phonics Check and the Multiplication tables check (and doing SOOOOO well). July has outdone the rest of the year with trips, leavers' assembly, hosting the Groundwork East VegFest, our incredible summer fayre, Oliver with a Twist, water fights, class parties, trips to the theatre, visitors from China for our Year 5 children, Mrs Jeakings returning to work, class transition days and probably so much I have forgotten!

We also took part in too many sporting events to write down! We collected silverware (as in first place/winners) in the Year 5 Boys Hunts FA Football Tournament and the SEND swimming

event. There were also more events like the Mother's Day Gift Shop and the LPSA Film Night which were organised. Mrs Castle has done wonders with the garden and also introducing Junior Duke. This has been so successful and we will definitely be running this again next year! In addition we have introduced Praise Points and Report Cards and had the first praise points celebrations AND have celebrated with many children receiving the Headteacher's Award and the Rotary Star. Our final Rotary Star for this year was Bradley from Year 6 for his fantastic first aid skills, attending school with such amazing confidence and making fantastic progress in his learning! Well done Bradley, you star!

WOW, another incredibly busy and successful year at Little Paxton has come to an end! I feel so privileged to lead such an amazing school community. I would like to take this opportunity to thank my wonderful staff team for everything they have done in making this year run so smoothly. Each one of them is so dedicated and always goes above and beyond. Thank you to each one of our families who support and encourage us, you are so appreciated and thank you to our awesome children. We are so fortunate to teach such curious, compassionate, caring, creative, courageous, confident (crazy - not one of our c's but maybe should be) children. Thank you for being you!

Have a wonderful summer break! We look forward to welcoming you back to school on Wednesday 3rd September at 8.40am when the gates open!

We have begun our 3 year project with Groundwork East starting with a new greenhouse, then onto weekly sessions with Hannah Smith and culminating in VegFest which we hosted and took place last week. Eight schools attended along with representatives from National Highways, who funded the project. We made some (hopefully!) very interesting contacts and will be applying for further funding next term.

We had a very interesting visit from Learning Through Landscapes about how our school can become more environmentally friendly and some of our ideas will be taking shape in September – one being the new addition of a woodland walk.

The other new addition this year was the den building activity, thanks to some hard work by my Junior Duke boys clearing the area. This has been a really popular site where teams have been able to enjoy the space for a week at a time. The winners of this years competition – judged by Mr. Rogers – was a Nightingale team made up of Emily, Elin, Millia and Avaani.

We had further funding which enabled us to have an extra greenhouse which has proved ideal for our tomatoes, cucumbers, chilis and aubergines. Helpers have been distributing some of our harvest at lunch time including some minted new potatoes and roasted courgettes.

We also had a trip the The Anchor to plant some flowers plus we took part in the RSPB Big Bird Watch.

Last week 10 of our Gardening Club visited Henbrook House Care Home. This proved to be a fantastic visit and thanks to Ms Hazell for organising and Miss Anderson for driving the minibus and attending – I don't think either of us imagined that the trip would involve us being sprayed with water guns! We put flowers in 2 planters, had a tour, a water fight and met some very interesting people. One of the residents was celebrating her 102nd birthday and looked extremely spritely and healthy. One of the children asked what her secret was and she replied "Hard work!" so an excellent lesson learnt.

An almost final thank you must go to the wonderful Mr Rogers and his team of helpers who have done so much to enhance the garden this year. They have enabled us to enjoy the garden even more with their many tasks: repurposing a fence to go around the potatoes, building the greenhouse, clearing the colouring area ready for a new roof, to name but a few. I know that Mr Rogers will want me say what tremendous effort all of his helpers have put in – Noah, Jacob, Harry, Libby and many more. I'm worried that Mr Rogers is now also in the habit of hiding every time he spots me!

Final thanks to all of those children who have helped, enjoyed and played in the garden. It's been a great year and will be even better next!


