We have had a busy week at Little Paxton and we are really back into the swing of school life.

It has been wonderful to see so many praise points being awarded so far this year with some children already getting their next reward (they never lose the points they have been given they just continue to add to their total). Outside at playtime and lunchtime the children's behaviour has been amazing. School is a calm, positive place. We had some lovely feedback from a perspective family who visited school on Wednesday afternoon which we were very pleased with about how happy and calm the children were. During my lunch duty I visited the garden and was reminded how fortunate we are to have such a lovely space for the children to relax in; to dig and to look after.

On Monday we had the first governors meeting of the school year. This was a fantastic opportunity to be able to share, and agree, with our governors the priorities for improvement for this year. The governors will be visiting school regularly to monitor the School Development Plan and to see that we are doing what we are saying we are doing. Governors also have a role in holding the school to account for the money we have and how we are spending it. There will be more information from our governors in future editions of the press. We are still in need of someone to join the board who has a background in finance (this could be a grandparent or a friend who would like to support our school) and there will be a parent governor election held this term. This year these are our improvement priorities for this year:

Priority 1:

To develop the 'Little Paxton Curriculum' to enable children to know more and remember more.

This priority will continue to address our Ofsted AFIs (areas for improvement from our inspection in February 2024)

Priority 2:

To improve the teaching, assessment and outcomes in writing across the school (with a particular focus on KS2) including how attainment in writing is reported to our families.

This priority will improve outcomes in writing for all our children.

Priority 3:

To continue to grow and develop leaders, including holding our leaders and middle leaders to account.

This includes developing our new SENDCo, Mrs Jeakings

Priority 4:

To equip our families to support their children at home and develop their understanding of the new curriculum.

Family engagement, support and communication

I know I have said this before but I need to say it again, one of the best parts of my role is when children come and visit with learning they are proud of or their teacher thinks is amazing. Emily (Kingfisher Year 4) came to visit with her History work about Anglo-Saxons. Emily was able to tell Mr Saxby, Mr Crabb and I so much about her learning and had clearly really enjoyed the lesson. Her work was also beautifully presented, well done Emily! I also had a wonderful time teaching Year 6 Netball this week, it's very important to me to continue to be present and active in the classrooms so I keep my teaching up to date, the children listened well and joined in brilliantly.

Mrs Jeakings has made a great start as our new SENDCo (Special Educational Needs and Disabilities Coordinator). She ran a very informative session on Tuesday evening for the families she is working with. This was well attended! Thank you to those who came and thank you to Mrs Jeakings for putting this event on. I am really excited about the vision Mrs Jeakings has to support children with SEND, and their families, at Little Paxton, building on the strong foundations which have been laid.

You may have read or heard about Ofsted in the news over the last few weeks. They have released new guidance (their school inspection toolkit) and are changing the way they inspect schools. Some of you many remember we put ourselves forward to be part of the pilot for this toolkit last year and they asked if they would be able to return once the toolkit had been finalised to complete a 2-day pilot inspection. The team have been in touch and we have invited them into school (yes you did read that right) on Tuesday and Wednesday next week. This will really support us in evaluating where our school sits in the new framework and identify areas for improvement. To say we are all looking forward to their visit is probably wrong but we are confident that this will be another way for us to ensure that Little Paxton is the best it can be and demonstrate our commitment to school improvement. So please don't panic if you see inspectors next week, we've actually asked them to visit us. There will be no written report and our grade will not change but we will be able to share the feedback we get from the team.

All that's left for me to say is have a wonderful weekend and we look forward to welcoming you to school when the gates open at 8.40am on Monday morning (remember Monday will be your last chance to buy tickets for the BIG BREAKFAST - we'll be selling tickets before school AND at the end of the day).
