This week Mr Saxby and I have had the opportunity to see some more brilliant teaching and amazing learning across the school. We have been watching English and Phonics lessons as we have a big focus this year on English, with writing being a particular focus, and children securing the foundational knowledge they need in English and Maths which is why phonics is so important. We have both been able to see the training staff have had making a difference in the classroom and the children responding so well to the expectations and the lessons. As I always say, we want to keep improving and ensuring that our children are getting the best that we can give them.

We have lots of different autumn illnesses going around at the moment so please do take care of yourselves and your families. They seem to be going round various year groups and staff and children are getting poorly. There is a fantastic NHS website called 'Is my child too ill for school?' which helps with making a decision on whether your child(ren) should stay at home or come into school. I would like to make you aware of the following information which we have been sent from the **Cambridgeshire Safeguarding Team:**

Dear all

We have been made aware of a potential issue with a website link found in some copies of the Spy Dog children's books by Andrew Cope. The web address has been taken over by a third party and now leads to an adult pornographic site. Consequently, the publisher Puffin and author Andrew Cope have halted sales and distribution of these books and are working to have the site removed through legal channels.

The publishers are aware and have recommended withdrawing all copies of the book. Our advice would be to simply remove the page from the book and make parents aware as children may also have the books at home.

This is a good opportunity to remind children about safer internet use and telling a trusted adult if they have accidentally visited an inappropriate site and to remind parents about actively engaging with their children's reading.

We will be making the children aware of this in an age appropriate way but wanted to share this with you as, as mentioned above, you may have copies of these books at home. We will be taking action in line with the above communication.

To finish on a positive I am so very thankful for our school community! #THRIVEin2025 has got off to a great start with £137 raised in one weekend. We will also be putting our running total on the window of the office so you can see it growing.

Message from Mr Saxby - Deputy Head

Happy Friday everyone and we are slowly but surely making our way to half term! I have been so impressed with the attitude of the children this week towards their learning.

Each time I write an article for the Paxton Press it will be focused on a different curriculum area!

I am really enjoying planning and teaching our new Modern Foreign Languages curriculum, and it has been great to see children enjoying learning a new language! We have tailored our new MFL curriculum to link to the three pillars of language learning which are phonics, vocabulary and grammar. We are keen to not only widen the children's French vocabulary but also how they can use the French sounds to read and spell correctly.

This term there has been a focus on the basics of French and specific French sounds. A few examples are the diagraph 'oi' making the /wa/ sound and 'er' diagraph making the sound /air/

or /ay/ dependent on where it comes in the word. We have also been looking at the grammar focus of 'c'est' which is French for this is/it is and est which means is. We have also looked at widening the vocabulary with lessons about greetings, colours and numbers. This means the children are now able to form simple sentences both verbally and written and start to decode different French words. Our most recent lesson was titled 'Ma famille extraterrestre' in which the children described different aliens and learnt the names of family members!




AGM This Tuesday! We need more volunteers for the LPSA


