Hello and happy Friday to our wonderful Little Paxton families,

We are officially half way through the school year! This term has disappeared in a flash despite the miserable weather we have had at the start of 2026 (I believe it has rained every day except one).

This week has been so much fun with lots of memories made and lots of learning happening around the school in different ways, including another Grafham Water Adventure Day. Our Upper School Adventure Day at Grafham Water was just brilliant! What made it really special was that some of the children were working in mixed year group teams and the way they were supporting and encouraging each other was just incredible and so wonderful to watch. The children were muddy, wet (some totally soaked through) and it wasn't the nicest of days weather wise but the smiles and sound of laughter made it all worth it! Seeing the children push themselves, try new things and work together as a team was amazing. During the day they all did one climbing activity; an orienteering activity and a build a bridge and get your team safely over the water challenge (yes this was the one where lots of children did not make it safely over the water). The children were all brilliantly behaved and a credit to the school. The team at Grafham also commented on how organised the visit was and how fantastic the children were! I do hope the children enjoyed their day as much as the staff did!

It was wonderful to see so many of you at our parents' evenings on Monday and Wednesday. The evenings ran really smoothly and it was lovely to see so many happy staff and families during these appointments. Thank you to all of you for coming along and thank you to the staff for their preparation for the appointments. In the Summer term there will be an opportunity for you to meet your child's current class teacher for the final time and then to book an appointment with their new teacher for next year. If you need to chat before then, there is also a Drop In on Wednesday 4th March between 3.30 and 4pm in school.

On Wednesday we had our PSHE day. I know how much the children, and staff, look forward to these days as it's something different. The theme was 'Health and Well-being' so perfect timing to be in Children's Mental Health Week. During the day the children complete various activities linked to our theme. There is so much time for the children to have discussions and share their thoughts and feelings. Mrs Rider kicked off the day with a brilliant assembly, including a dance and calming activity, then off the children went to enjoy the rest of their day. I really enjoyed working with the Kites on our 'Weather Emotions Activity' they had some incredible ideas and thoughtful suggestions of strategies we could use when we are feeling happy, sad, worried or angry. They produced some brilliant work as well and I know there was excellent learning going

on in other classes too! At the end of the day the children had a well-being festival with workshops being run by different members of the teaching team.

Mr Saxby, Mr Inns and I have been VERY impressed with Kite Class and the Year 4 Maths group we have had the privilege of teaching over the last week. The children are keen and eager to learn and have shown how dedicated they are to their learning. We are all looking forward to continuing to work with them whilst Mrs O'Callaghan is not in school.

I hope that you all have an enjoyable half term and we look forward to welcoming you back to school for Spring 2 on Monday 23rd February at 8.40am when the gates open!

The Treehouse Transformation – Creating Calm Together

This year, I have placed a real focus on strengthening the provision available for any child who may at times feel anxious, overwhelmed, worried or simply in need of a quiet moment. Importantly, The Treehouse is a space for all children, because, as a school, we know that every child can benefit from learning how to pause, regulate and reset.

My vision was to create a calm, welcoming environment with carefully chosen resources to help children manage their emotions and feel safe. I wanted The Treehouse to feel less like a room you “go to” and more like a space you step into — somewhere that immediately feels different from the busy pace of the school day.

And so... the transformation began! While I can't quite claim a Changing Rooms dramatic reveal (no Laurence Llewelyn-Bowen feature wall just yet!), The Treehouse has recently been treated

to a beautiful new coat of paint in a carefully mixed calming shade. A huge thank you to Mr Rogers, who not only painted the room but ensured the colour was just right — a far cry from magnolia, and thankfully no zebra print involved.

We've also added soft, calming lighting around the edges of the room to help create a gentle, soothing atmosphere. It may not be quite Grand Designs, but we are very proud of the peaceful feel the space now has.


A special thank you must also go to Mrs Shirley for her dedication in co-ordinating the preparation work and helping shape this space into something purposeful and nurturing for all children. Her ideas and organisation behind the scenes has ensured that The Treehouse is not only calming, but practical and accessible.

We are continuing to develop the space by adding sensory resources that will further support children with regulation and relaxation. If any families have items at home they no longer need — such as bean bags, sensory bubble lamps, yoga balls, textured tiles, fidget toys or even somewhere for the children to tidily put their shoes — we would be incredibly grateful for donations.

Please know there is absolutely no expectation — your continued support of the school in all the ways you already give is always appreciated — but if you would like to help us build our very own Treehouse makeover, we would be most thankful. 

My Online Safety Rules

- I will only use school IT equipment for activities agreed by school staff.
- I will only delete my own files unless my teacher gives me permission to delete someone else's.
- I will not look at other people's files.
- I will not use my personal email address or other personal accounts in school when doing school work.
- I will not sign up for any online service on school devices unless this is an agreed part of a school project approved by my teacher and agreed by my parent/carer.
- I will only open email attachments if it has been approved by a member of school staff in school or a parent/carer out of school. If I am unsure about an attachment, I will ask an adult for help.
- I will not tell anyone other than my parents/carers my passwords. I will not use other people's usernames or passwords to pretend to be them online.
- I will make sure that all online contact I make is responsible, polite and sensible.
- I will be kind and respectful at all times.
- I will not deliberately look for, save or send anything that someone could find unpleasant or upsetting. If I come across anything upsetting, unpleasant or nasty, or anything that makes me feel unsafe, I will tell my teacher or my parent/carer immediately.
- If someone says, asks or posts anything upsetting, unpleasant or nasty, about me or anything that makes me feel unsafe, I will not reply. I will tell my teacher, my parent/carer or another trusted adult immediately.
- I will not give out my own or other people's personal information such as name, phone number, home address, interests, schools or clubs. If I have to use a name online, I will use an anonymous nickname. I will tell my teacher or parent/carer if anyone asks me online for personal information.
- Uploading or sending my image (photographs, videos, live streaming) online puts me at risk. I will always seek permission from my teacher or parent/carer if I wish

to do this. I will not take, share or upload any image of anyone else without their permission and also, if they are a child, without their parent's/carer's permission.

- Even if I have permission, I will not upload any images, videos, sounds or words that **could** upset, now or in the future, any member of the school community, as this is cyberbullying.
- I understand that some people on the internet are not who they say they are, and some people are not safe to be in contact with. I will not arrange to meet someone I only know on the internet. If someone asks to meet me, I will not reply to them and I will tell a teacher or a parent/carer immediately.
- I understand that everything I do or receive online can be traced now and in the future. I know it is important to build a good online reputation.
- I understand that some personal devices are allowed in school and some are not, and I will follow the rules. I will not assume that new devices can be brought into school without getting permission.
- I will not lie about my age in order to access games, apps or social networks that are for older people as this will put me at risk.

Important Dental Information

Extra urgent dental care appointments

NHS Cambridgeshire and Peterborough Integrated Care Board has requested that the following information is shared with parents.

The local NHS is reminding families of the extra urgent NHS dental care appointments are available across Cambridgeshire and Peterborough. These appointments help with common urgent problems such as severe dental pain, excessive bleeding of the gums and loose or broken crowns and bridges.

If you or your child needs urgent dental help, visit NHS 111 online or call 111. Symptoms will be checked and you'll be given details of the local dental practices that offer urgent dental care. If your family already sees a dentist, please contact them first. If they can't help, NHS 111 will explain what to do next.

As patients are not linked or registered to one specific practice, those who need urgent NHS dental care can contact any practice offering NHS services across Cambridgeshire and Peterborough to see if urgent care appointments are available.

Urgent NHS dental care appointments are for anybody of any age who needs urgent dental care. Charges start from £27.40 unless you qualify for free NHS care or help with costs. NHS dental care is free for all children under 18, or those under 19 in eligible full-time education.
