Hello and happy Friday to our wonderful Little Paxton families,

Looks like I spoke too soon about the sunshine and spring really arriving. I am sure that you have been enjoying the brighter weather and the lighter evenings, I know that I have! I am so very thankful to our staff team for supporting in enabling us to get our full OPAL provision up and running again after the winter break. The children have really enjoyed the dressing up (it really made me smile to see some of our Year 5 boys in full dress up on Wednesday); the trim trails; the loose parts; the tyre swings and the small world.

OPAL NEEDS YOU: we are after dressing up clothes, wellies, small world toys (lego, dolls, dinosaurs, cars), pots and pans, guttering or plastic drain pipes, suitcases - if you can help us please speak to Mr Saxby or Miss Anderson!

Whilst the field is a bit muddy, children must have a change of shoes to access it. We do have spare wellies the children can borrow to use the field but it would really be beneficial if your child brought an old pair of trainers/wellies to school (they can be stored here) to wear on the field!

It's been another week to celebrate the art going on in our school. Children in Year 5 and 6 have brought their amazing work to share with me, their art is all based around endangered animals. This week they were using a grid to enable them to recreate a piece of art themselves. I was so impressed with their drawing skills and they were all very keen to share their work with you as well. Well done to Cody, Jonah H, Lilly, Clara, Emily P, Lily, Rohan and Rocco.

Miss Decker asked me to come and visit Pippa from Merlin class who has completed some amazing independent writing in provision about their 'Drawing Club' book the 'Very Hungry Caterpillar'. I was so proud of Pippa's amazing sentence and her life cycle.

Bethany and Paige from Year 6 also came to visit me because they were very proud of their learning. They wanted to share their English and Maths work with me, it was really nice to hear how enthusiastic they were about their learning and to look back in their books and see how much progress they had made!

On Monday afternoon I visited Raven Class as all of the children wanted me to see the mixed artwork they had created. I loved how different their pieces were and how much they had clearly enjoyed their lessons.

Speaking of lessons, Mr Saxby and I have been completing our termly formal lesson observations this week (with a couple running into next week). This gives us a chance to visit all of the classrooms with a specific focus. We have been looking at as many children participating in lessons as possible, checking children's understanding of the learning within lessons rather than just when their work is marked and teachers modelling strong foundations (of reading, writing and maths) across the curriculum. It is such a privilege to see our brilliant team at work and to observe fantastic teaching and learning. We are very fortunate to have such a great team at Little Paxton and it was wonderful to be reminded of this during our observations. We are looking forward to being able to share this with those of you who are coming into school next week for 'Come See and Celebrate'. There are still spaces in every group apart from year 1 and 2.



Hold the front page! Extra Shout out!







Parenting top tip **Top Tips** What to do when children argue

Children often argue because they haven't yet learned emotional regulation skills. Helping them practise calm-down techniques during non-stressful times makes it more likely they'll use them during conflicts. **Examples to teach-** taking a deep breath; stepping away from the argument briefly, using a "calm voice", saying what they need instead of blaming. If appropriate think about allowing for some negotiation and choice. For example: 'Would you like to do your homework before or after tea?' 'You can tidy up by yourself or I can help you.' 'Would you like to have your screentime in the morning or the afternoon?' Children do get told what to do quite a lot, and some (especially those who are strong willed) like to feel that they have some control and offering choices helps with that.

Activity

We have had a lot of rain lately! Adults often see it as an inconvenience don't they but looked at through a child's eyes it can be fun. So next time it's raining why not put your waterproofs on and head outdoors. Here's an idea that might appeal to your little ones.

Start a raindrop orchestra



Take some different objects outside to see what sounds the rain makes when it falls on them. Try different-sized saucepans or raid your recycling for foil containers and empty tin cans. Can you hear heavy drumming, a soft pitter-patter or pretty tinkling sounds? Try to create as many different sounds as possible and make some raindrop music.
