Hello and happy Friday to our wonderful Little Paxton families,

We have had a fantastic week at Little Paxton with lots going on. The sun has been shining and this really has made a big difference, especially to our enjoyment of playtime and lunchtime.

It was wonderful to welcome those of you who attended 'Come, See and Celebrate' on Wednesday morning to our school. This was a chance for those booked in to come in and join in with their children's Maths learning. We have had some really positive feedback from families, especially about how enthusiastic the children are about their learning when they are in the classroom. In total we welcomed 18 families.

One of the days I look forward to every term is the Headteacher's Awards. This is an amazing opportunity to celebrate 2 children from each class who have demonstrated an ongoing commitment to their learning during the term and who have impressed the staff with their dedication and hard work.
