**YOUR WEEKLY "HELLO" FROM MISS O**

Hello and happy Friday to our wonderful Little Paxton families,

I can't believe I am writing to you all at the end of the Spring Term. This year is continuing to fly by! Although this term has been short we have crammed so much learning and fun into it! I wanted to say a special 'hello' to the new families who have joined our Little Paxton School Community this term, it has been wonderful to get to know you and we're so very glad you are here!

As you know, I very much believe in being a headteacher rather than simply a head so I try and be in the classroom at least once a week to see the children and to keep myself sharp as a teacher. It also brings me lots of joy so win, win! This week I have had the privilege of teaching the Woodpeckers once and a year 1 group once. I was so impressed with the children's enthusiasm for learning, their curiosity and their questions. Their instruction writing for making their own 'Gruffalo Crumble' was fantastic (I am not sure some of the pies would taste very nice as they had some very interesting ingredients including Mr Saxby in one, Miss Henson in another and even myself). At Little Paxton we use Little Wandle to teach phonics and early reading (mainly in lower school) and I covered a reading group this week. It is amazing to see how quickly the children make progress and how much their reading had improved since the last time I read with them.

On Wednesday, I was invited to meet the judge for the 'Green Flag Award' who was visiting Little Paxton Playing Field to see if they could maintain their green flag status. It was a great opportunity to gather together with other village groups and share how we as a school make use of the playing fields. Mrs Darlow came with me, representing the LPSA, and we spoke to those who were there about OPAL and Thrive and one of the people we met has already been up to school and given us some lovely things for the children. It is always an honour to represent our school and have the opportunity to shout about what is great about Little Paxton School to people who might be able to help us.

Part of the updates we made to the curriculum was to organise PSHE, Computing and D&T in days so that the children see their project or theme through from beginning to end. This term's DT focus has been textiles. I have been VERY impressed with the sewing skills of the children and also now know which of the staff team I will go to if I need anything fixing. Mrs Rider organised another brilliant PSHE day all about safety. This included learning about safe people and had a particular focus on rail safety. As part of the day the Year 1/2 children all went out to learn about crossing the road thinking about where would be safe to cross if there wasn't a zebra crossing. I particularly enjoyed reliving my childhood by watching the hedgehog 'King of

the Road' advert (I wonder if any of you remember that). Mrs Rider is writing an article about PSHE day for the press which will be published after the break!

We really enjoy working with two training providers (The University of Cambridge & CTSN) and part of this partnership is hosting trainee teachers. We currently have two trainee teachers working in Starling and Lark Class. We had a lovely email about Miss Rose saying that her trainee teacher had nominated her for mentor of the month. I thought I would share it with you as we're very proud:

## Paxton Panthers Power to Glory at Huntingdonshire District Finals - Mr Pool

The Paxton Panthers Flag Football team delivered a day of grit, skill and unforgettable drama as they battled their way through the Huntingdonshire District Finals - ultimately emerging as champions and securing their place at the East Anglia Regional Finals in May.

### **A Strong Start: Panthers 14 – 0 Upwood**

Paxton opened the tournament in style. Facing Upwood in their first group game, the Panthers wasted no time asserting themselves. Sharp passing, confident running and disciplined defence saw them cruise to a commanding **14 – 0 victory**, setting the tone for the day.

### **A Setback Against Crosshall: Panthers 6 - 14 Crosshall**

Their second match proved far more challenging. Crosshall struck early with an interception returned for a touchdown, putting Paxton on the back foot. The Panthers responded brilliantly, levelling the score shortly after, but Crosshall found a late breakthrough to seal a **14 – 6 win**.

### **Quarter-Final Thriller: Panthers 7 – 6 Buckden**

Finishing the group stage in 8th place meant a daunting quarter-final against the No.1 seeds, Buckden. What followed was one of the performances of the tournament. Paxton's defence was immense, holding off wave after wave of Buckden attacks. Even after falling behind by a touchdown, the Panthers refused to fold.

In the dying moments, Paxton struck—scoring a dramatic touchdown before calmly converting the bonus point to complete a stunning 7 – 6 upset victory.

### **Semi-Final Comeback: Panthers 8 – 6 Bury Broncos**

The semi-final against the Bury Broncos was a tense, tactical battle. With both defences standing firm, the game remained scoreless deep into the second half. Bury eventually broke through to take a 6 - 0 lead, but Paxton were far from finished.

With two minutes left, Amelia weaved past defenders to score, tying the game at 6–6. The pressure was immense, but Harrison rose to the moment, pulling in a superb catch for the two bonus points. The Panthers completed another comeback, winning **8–6** and booking their place in the final.

### **Final Showdown: Panthers 9 – 0 Crosshall**

Fate delivered a rematch with Crosshall - the only team to beat Paxton earlier in the day. This time, the Panthers were ready.

Both teams battled fiercely, with defences dominating. The deadlock finally broke when Paxton forced a safety tackle in the Crosshall endzone, earning a crucial 2–0 lead. As the clock ticked into the final two minutes, Paxton struck again - breaking away for a touchdown before Harrison added yet another bonus point.

When the final whistle sounded, the scoreboard read **9–0 to Paxton**, and the players erupted into celebrations, sprinting in every direction as the magnitude of their achievement sank in.

### **Champions of Huntingdonshire**

The Paxton Panthers' remarkable journey—marked by resilience, teamwork and big-game composure—earned them the title of **Huntingdonshire District Champions** and a well-deserved place at the East Anglia Regional Finals in May.

A huge congratulations to the players who represented the team with such pride and determination:

Ella, Amelia, Elise, Samar, Harrison, Diaz, Teddy, Freddie, Charlie, Rohan and Noah.

Their teamwork, spirit and refusal to give up made this a day they will never forget.

**A Bit About Me**  
Hi, my name is Katie, and I am your school's Link EIFA.  
As an EIFA I offer advice and strategies to parents and carers with a Primary School aged child that may be experiencing some challenges such as routines, sleep, sibling rivalry, challenging behaviour, worries or self-esteem. If you'd like a chance to chat about any of these topics, just contact me on the details found at the bottom of this newsletter.

**Parenting Top Tips**  
A **visual timetable** can help your child to understand the structure and activities of the day. Click the link to create your own visual timetable: [Visual Timetable cards.pdf](#)  
**Special time** is a daily interaction with your child that is child led, it doesn't need to be a long period of time, it can be just 10 mins. Playing with your child helps to build a warm relationship and a strong attachment between family members, it also helps to develop a child's communication and social skills. Your child will learn to problem solve, test out their ideas and allows time to explore their imagination.  
**Praise**, make sure you acknowledge and praise your child, catch them doing the right thing and praise them, using descriptive language such as "I liked that you shared your colouring pens".  
**Emotion Coaching**, emotion coaching supports emotional literacy, which means to recognise and understand feelings. You can help your child by doing activities together to practice develop their emotional literacy.  
**Feelings thermometer**, this can help your child to identify how they are feeling.  
**Storytime reflection**, after reading a book ask your child how they think the character felt and what would they do in that situation.

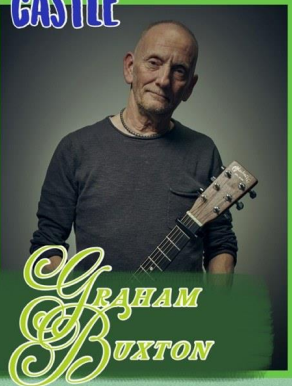
