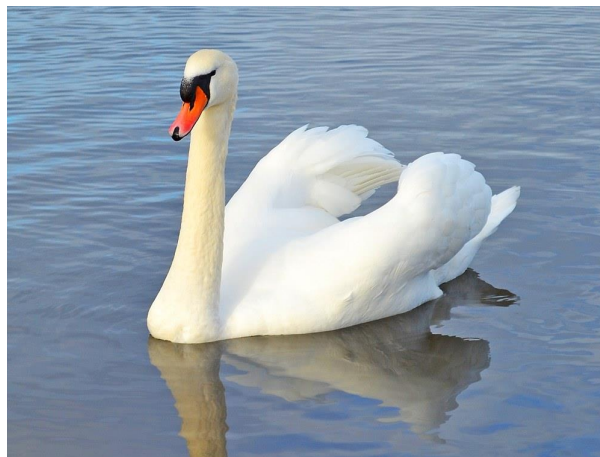

Hello and happy Friday to our wonderful Little Paxton families,

In true Little Paxton style, we have had a very busy week. It's crazy to think that we only have one school week left of the current year, where has that time gone? It was great to see

so many children coming to school on Monday in their England colours to celebrate England's win against Mexico. Here's hoping that the boys will do it again on Saturday night!

LP Fest was just amazing this week. I love seeing our school community come together and spend time with one another. It was so well supported, even in the hot weather. Thank you so much to all of you who joined us. I really appreciate the staff who planned, set up, ran, and packed down, the event. It is such a brilliant time!

We also travelled to a land far, far away this week with our Year 6 children performing 'Shrek the Musical' as their end of year production. All of the school watching during the day and we had the hall packed with friends and family in the evening. I love watching the productions as there is always at least one child who surprises us with their hidden talents. The children were awesome and I know that anyone who watched, were as proud as we were of the cast. A massive thanks to all the year 6 team for working with the children to create such a fantastic show!

It was wonderful to have some of our ex-pupils, who are Language Leaders at Longsands, come into school on Wednesday to deliver lessons to some of our children. I know our Little Paxton children enjoyed the sessions and the ex-pupils loved visiting again. We also welcomed our new EYFS children, their families, and their teddies, to school on Thursday for the Teddy Bear's Picnic. Due to the hot weather, this took place in our school hall. We can't wait for the children to join us officially in September.

We have had a few near misses over the last number of weeks on the road outside school, especially at drop off. Please don't forget that you should not park on the zig zag lines; stop at the crossing (when there is no-one crossing) for your children to get out of the car or let children out of the car into the road so they have to stand on the road before they can get to the path. If you need to park for drop off, come at 9am (you're not late until 9.10am) as there is always plenty of room by then. In addition, we have noticed children who are not in Year 5 or Year 6 coming into the playground, or through the office, in the morning without an adult. Children need to be accompanied by an adult until the whistle blows at 8.50am, unless they are in Year 5 or Year 6 and have completed the permission form which allows them to walk to/from school on their own. I was worried for the children's safety, on Thursday morning in particular. Let's work together to keep our children safe.

I had a very proud message from a parent telling me about the success some of our children had over the weekend at their national cheerleading competition. The girls are all part of Falcon Flames, who train in school on Monday and Thursday. Ruby J, Rae, Ada, Matilda, Scarlett, Marnie and Summer came 2nd in their group cheer routine. Ruby and Summer came FIRST in their stunt routine; Matilda achieved first place in her dance solo; Summer came 1st in her dance solo AND Scarlett and Marine placed FIRST in their dance duet. I am delighted to be able to share their success with you all! Congratulations girls, we are so very proud of you all!

It was a week for proud messages from parents, as I received this as well - Edward is going to Disneyland with the 1st Little Paxton Scouts next year and they have been challenged to do some fundraising as part of the preparation. He challenged himself (and his mum) to walk around Grafham water, all 9 miles/15km of it. His mum told me: *they set off early this morning and finished around lunchtime. The walk was long and tough going but Ed persevered and managed the whole thing with ease (he even went on the giant bouncy pillow afterwards). He did an excellent job and has raised an amazing £365 so far!* Well done to Edward, and mum, we're very proud of you!

I would also like to wish our children who are competing in the Dance World Cup in Dublin over the next few days, good luck. We are cheering them all on!

I had a flock of Ravens come to visit me to share their writing with me, I was really impressed with their work. After I had already sent my 'hello' to the office, a group of children came round with some of their work to show me. 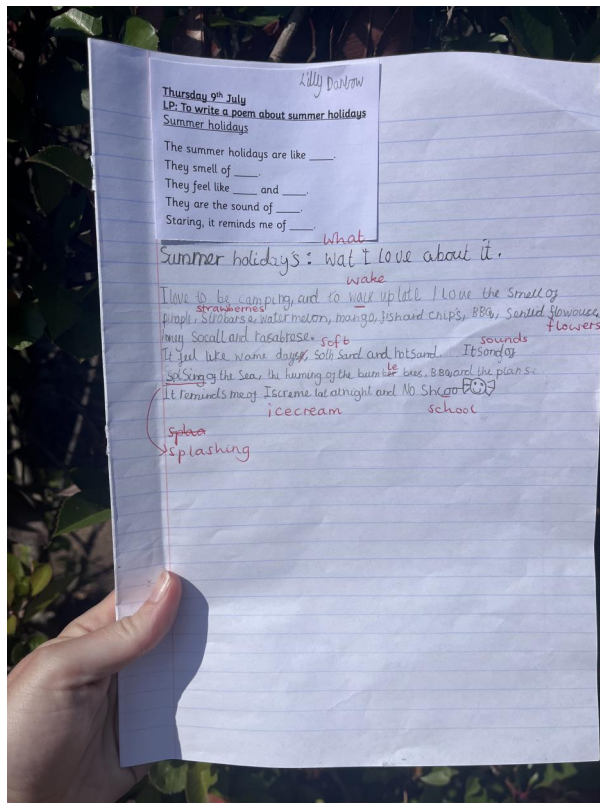
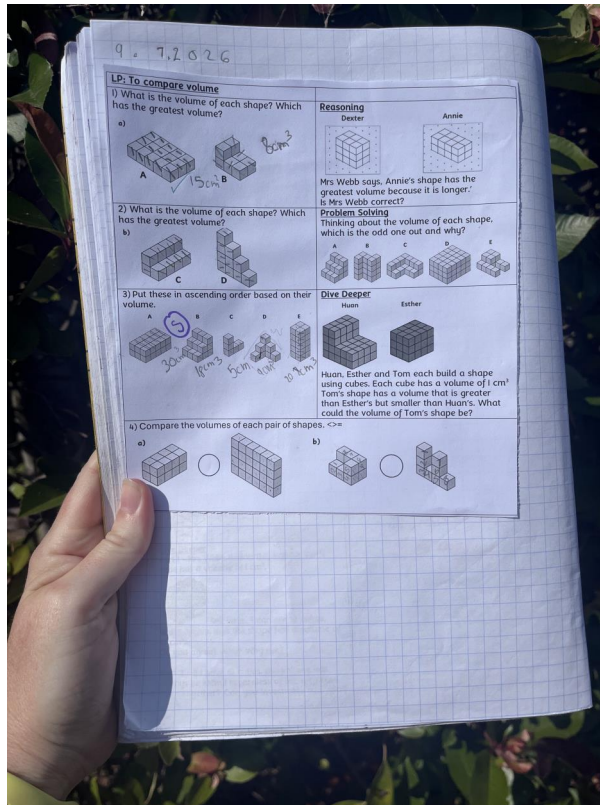
Well done to you all and thank you for working so hard!

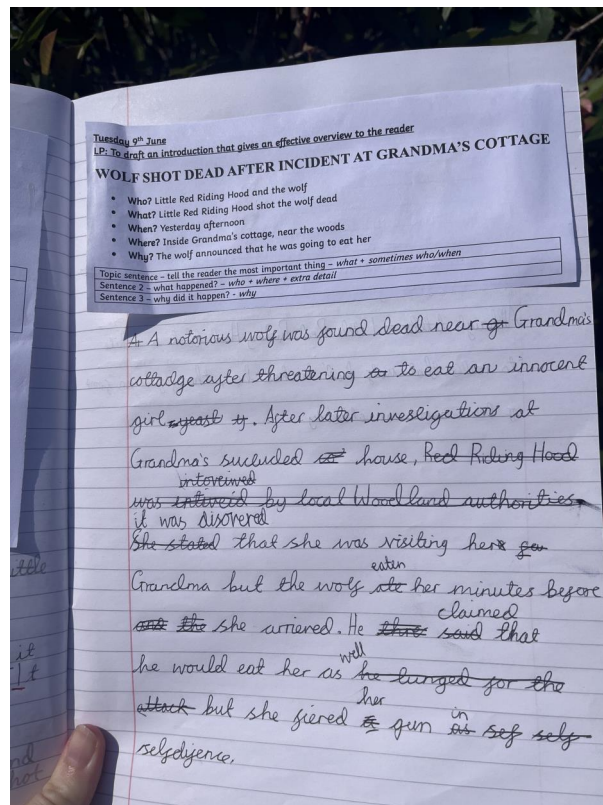

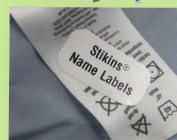

Free School Meal Changes



The Department for Education (DfE) has recently updated its guidance on Free School Meals (FSM), with important changes coming into effect from September 2026.

You will be receiving an email at the end of July giving full details of the changes and confirming how you apply or re-apply for free school meals, so please look out for this email.

Free School Meals funding is important to schools as this may carry extra funding for the school, so we would ask everyone to look at the email (on 31st July) and eligibility criteria.

If your child is in EYFS, Yr 1 or 2 you will still continue to receive Universal Free School Meals however, you should apply or re-apply for the FSM if eligible.

If your child is moving from Yr 2 to Yr 3 their Universal Free School Meal entitlement ends and meals will be chargeable at £3.05. Schoolgrid will automatically change to enable you to pay. Direct Debit can be set up with school grid to make payments easier. We will also reconfirm this in an email to you towards the end of term.

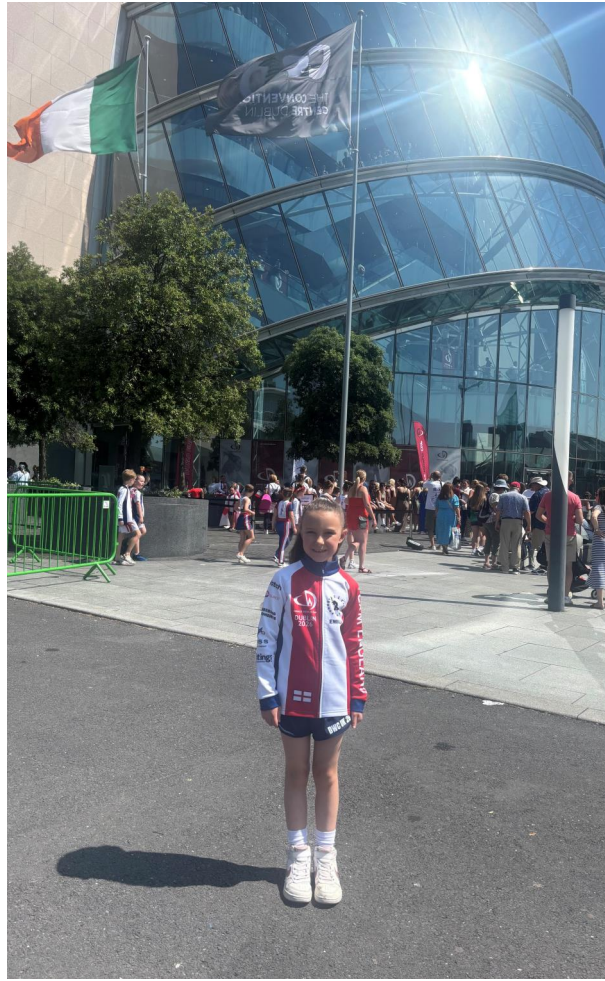


Emilia, Melodie, Ariella & Phoebe
