Hello and happy Friday to our wonderful Little Paxton families,

We have managed to pack so much into the 4 days the children have been at school this week! There has been some amazing learning happening, as well as beginning to get ready for the end of the year.

During our teacher training day on Monday, we spent time as a staff team moderating (checking) our end of year writing assessments for all of our children. This moderation formed the first part of the handover from teacher to teacher. All staff know the next steps for the children they will be teaching for English next year which means everyone can hit the ground running. The second part of the day was sharing information about the children from teacher to teacher so that the staff know their new classes as well as possible before September. Whilst this was happening, Mr Saxby and I met with most of the year groups to share how we want the year groups to work, especially the mixed year groups, to ensure all children have the best teaching possible alongside the best support.

Speaking of transition, our transition day ran really smoothly. The children all took to their new classes quickly and it was lovely to walk around the school and see how engaged the children were in their learning. I am incredibly proud of them all for taking it in their stride. Most of our Year 6 children also had their transition day(s) to their new schools this week as well, it's always a lot to take in, especially getting used to a new, bigger environment. You should all get confirmation of your child's class, and teacher, via Dojo today. Just a reminder there is an opportunity for you to say hello to your child's new teacher and goodbye to their current teacher on Tuesday 14th and Wednesday 15th July. These appointments can only be 5 minutes as we want to make space for as many people as possible to book in within the time frame we have.

It's LP FEST next Wednesday after school. Last year's event was brilliant. Our school community turning up and having a great time together is one of the main reasons it is so successful. So please, please put the date in your diary, on the fridge, set a reminder on your phone and turn up for an afternoon of fun to raise money for our fantastic school. It is only on until 5.30pm but there will be stalls, food, drinks, the return of the bouncy slide, and much more!

I have seen some amazing writing, art and vegetables this week. Yes you read that right, vegetables! The Ravens have been incredibly proud of their writing, I have managed to see 3 of the children already, but my board is full of more names that I will have to get round to next

week. I loved reading Evalyn's Paddington diary and the fact files about beetles created by Willow and Poppy. All the girls went off with something from my stash. Pigeon class were so proud of their art work that I went to visit them. They are coming to the end of a unit of work on pop art and have drawn some incredible pop art portraits. In order to ensure that the children are able to watch the match, and come to school on time, we are screening a special replay so we can cheer England on together. The children do not have to watch the game, normal lessons will be happening as well. Let's all keep the result as quiet as we can to make watching the match together as much fun as possible.

Free School Meal Changes



The Department for Education (DfE) has recently updated its guidance on Free School Meals (FSM), with important changes coming into effect from September 2026.

You will be receiving an email at the end of July giving full details of the changes and confirming how you apply or re-apply for free school meals, so please look out for this email.

Free School Meals funding is important to schools as this may carry extra funding for the school, so we would ask everyone to look at the email (on 31st July) and eligibility criteria.

If your child is in EYFS, Yr 1 or 2 you will still continue to receive Universal Free School Meals however, you should apply or re-apply for the FSM if eligible.

If your child is moving from Yr 2 to Yr 3 their Universal Free School Meal entitlement ends and meals will be chargeable at £3.05. Schoolgrid will automatically change to enable you to pay. Direct Debit can be set up with school grid to make payments easier. We will also reconfirm this in an email to you towards the end of term.

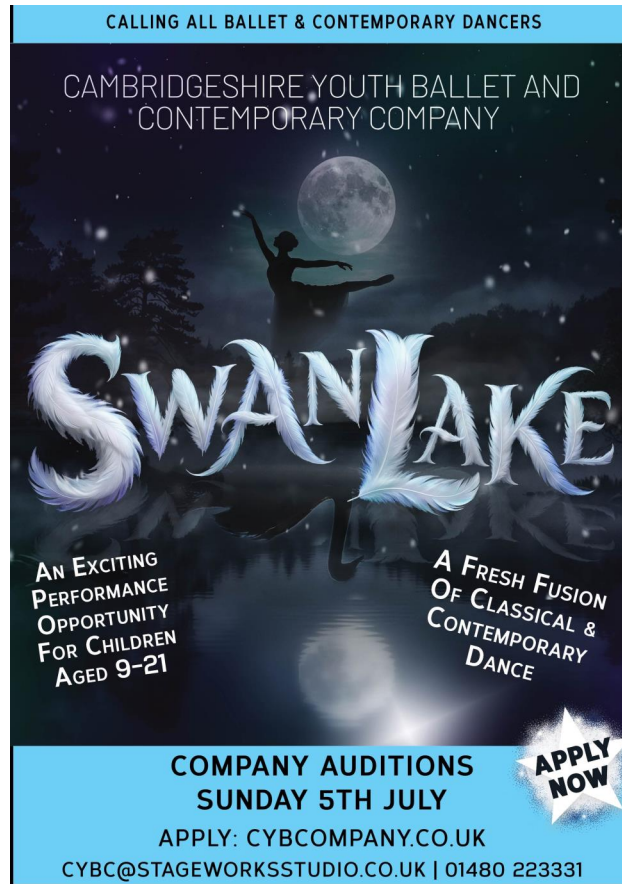
